






However, relativism about religion (religious pluralism or religious diversity) is not always so benign or harmless.

Religious pluralism generally regards religious differences to be either:


- a. largely cultural and unconnected to specific truth claims about reality, or
- b. representative of deeper truths unified as an expression of something residing deeply in the human psyche.










It proscribes a way of life, and, thus, obligates certain behaviors.

















A Universalism &

Universalists reject the notion of eternal damnation.






🦻 Inclusivism 🛩

Christ saves not only those who consciously believe the gospel, but also all who never heard the gospel but fulfilled other requirements (e.g., responded to what they knew)






All religions can lead to God. Salvation is not necessarily based on Jesus Christ. For some, Pluralism is distinguished from Universalism in that Pluralism says that any religion can save but not necessarily all will be actually saved.



"[Religions] all affirm a way, a path; and the paths are all recognizable variants of the same path, the same way. ... The Way of the cross, the way of Lao Tzu, the way of the Buddha, the way of Islam, and the way of Judaism all speak of the same path: the path of dying to an old identity and way of being and being born into a new identity and way of being. All refer to the same transformation of the self."
















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One can only believe the gospel by hearing the gospel. (Rom 10:14)
